This court case, U.S. v. Texas, will be decided by the Supreme Court Justices. A majority ruling (five or more Justices) in favor of the U.S. must be made for DAPA and expanded DACA to survive. In any circumstance, we hope to see more opportunities for immigrants soon.



Supreme Court Justices are nominated by the President and then the Senate votes to confirm the person. A Supreme Court Justice can hold this position for life as long as the Justice has good behavior.
